Reminders for retailers and cosmetologists

- **Remember the sell-through period.** In-state retailers with products on hand as of 1 January 2025 can sell through the end of 2025. Products purchased by in-state retailers after 1 January 2025 for use or resale must comply with the Toxic-Free Cosmetics Act (TFCA).
- Contact the distributor to confirm products being purchased do not have chemicals restricted by TFCA. If the distributor does not know, inform Washington Ecology, and they can work with the distributor.
- **Check products for restricted chemicals**. For more detailed guidance, read the <u>Toxic-Free Cosmetics Act Guide</u> or <u>send an email</u> for help.

Formaldehyde rulemaking updates
