It provides guidance on the production process and establishes maximum limits for heavy metals and other relevant compositional parameters in the final product. The standard also outlines microbiological criteria applicable to Tequila to ensure product safety and quality.</p>

Objective and rationale, including the nature of urgent problems where applicable: This development was undertaken to introduce the general and specific requirements, as well as classifications, in order to ensure alignment with current international practices. The standard is intended for use by manufacturers, bottlers, and importers of rum products to ensure that consumers in Jamaica are supplied with products of acceptable quality and</p>
